# Murray Elementary School Library/Information Center News 

Things are off to a GREAT start at the Murray Elementary School Library/Information Center. Over the summer, an additional 500 items (valued at $\$ 8,500$ ) were added to our "Opening Day Collection." When Murray Elementary School opened last school year, our "Opening Day Collection" contained approximately 9,400 books, 1100 e-books, and over 250 DVD's.

All students come to the Library/Information Center once a week with their classes for an hour. At this time, a variety of books, authors, and genres of literature are introduced as well as a variety of skills are taught to support the regular classroom curriculum. Also, during this time new vocabulary words are discussed and various reading skills like drawing conclusions, summarizing, main idea, making inferences, and other Standards for the 21st Century Learner are emphasized. During the upcoming weeks, students will be given a handout that they can take and keep at home. This handout will contain passwords to our online subscription databases and taught how to use these various databases to complete research projects and assignments.
