Second Grade Snip-its:)

The last few weeks, 2nd graders have been focusing on the concept of identifying main idea and details. Families sent in a Main Idea bag, which consisted of 3-4 clues that students could look at and agree on a main idea for the bag. The bags that were submitted were amazing, and the kids had a great time looking through them!

Examples of the bags were; a base-ball, tickets and a Sand Gnats program, a banana, apple and carrots and paintbrushes, paint, a small picture and an easel. The students were able to look at the details and arrive at a main idea. Excellent! Thank you for the support from home.

In math, the fifth grade students learned three different ways to multiply. We are full of strategies! Next, we will be moving on to division. In reading, we learned about Satchel Paige and we sequenced the story. In social studies, we are now learning about Native American tribes

Attendance is essential to school success. However, too often, students and parents do not realize how quickly absences, excused and unexcused, can add up to academic trouble. Chronic absenteeism, missing 10% of the school year or more, or just 2-3 days every month-can translate into third-graders unable to master reading, sixth-graders failing courses and ninth-graders dropping out of high school.

Data Point

Terra Nova, Spring 2015 - 3rd Grade

This past spring, our students had an outstanding performance on the Terra Nova. The third grade year is the first time our students are exposed to the Terra Nova. They performed very well. Seventy-eight percent of 3rd Grade students scored in the top two quarters on the math section and 85% of our students scored in the top two quarters on the science section. Sixty-five percent of the 3rd grade class scored in the top two quarters on the social studies section. Fifty percent of them scored in the top two quarters in both reading and language arts.

Join us in congratulating our students on their wonderful performance. We look forward to seeing even more positive results from them as they embark on their journey through fourth grade this school year.

Sixth Grade Hi-Lites!!

Murray's 6th graders have been hard at work! They started the year creating graphs and analyzing data to solve problems. The students have also graphed ordered pairs on a coordinate plane to make pictures and maps. 6th graders researched and presented information on robots and their place in 21st Century schools, hospitals, and the military. Currently, 6th graders are taking an expedition back in time to Ancient Egypt to explore pharaohs' tombs, decode hieroglyphics, and discover the importance of the Nile River. Students will be refining their writing skills by infusing figurative language into their originally created stories. Murray's 6th graders are off to a great start in the new school year!
